



THE AUSTRALIAN WAR MEMORIAL COLLECTIONS

The Australian War Memorial is at the same time, a museum, archive and memorial. Its extensive collections were founded by Charles Bean and John Treloar who began collecting records including unit war diaries and relics (the material evidence of conflict) during the First World War. The collections contain items from colonial conflicts to the present day and are incorporated into the curatorial areas of Art, Research Centre, Photographs, Film and Sound, Military Heraldry and Technology (MHT). These collections lie at the heart of the Memorial, helping Australians to remember, interpret and understand the Australian experience of war and its enduring impact on Australian society.

The MHT collection contains an extensive range of objects illustrating Australia's military history and dates from the Australian colonial period to current conflicts and peacekeeping activities. It includes a comprehensive range of Australian, enemy and allied forces' material that has been collected on the Memorial's behalf during wartime, or donated or purchased since.

The **Military Heraldry** collection comprises a wide variety of material, including uniforms, the nation's largest collection of Victoria Crosses, a large collection of other significant honours and awards, regimental colours and flags, souvenirs and personal equipment. In addition, the collection contains battlefield relics, some of which were collected by one of the founders of the Memorial, CEW Bean, and by others charged with this activity in two world wars and current conflicts. The **Military Technology** collection comprises thousands of items, ranging in size from a surgical needle to a four-engined bomber. The objects include aircraft, vehicles, vessels, communications equipment, weapons, models, meteorological equipment, medical instruments, cameras, and optical devices.

Some of the objects held in the MHT collections which relate to the $2/2^{nd}$ Machine Gun Battalion include:

A Nazi vehicle identification flag collected by QX17455 Private Leonard Roger Mason of the 2/2nd Machine Gun Battalion from a German underground storage area during the battle of El Alamein on 3 November 1942. The flag was signed by members of the battalion and bought back to Australia by QX9860 Private William Johnston Murray.

The colour patch worn by NX45258 Private Earle Arthur 'Jack' Burrows, 2/2nd Machine Gun Battalion.

RELAWM32122.002-.008

Military Medal and medal group to NX27134 Private Ronald George McGregor, 2/2nd Machine Gun Battalion. The citation for the Military Medal reads as follows: 'In the TELL EL EISA area on 22 July 42, NX27134, Pte. McGregor, R. G. was No. 3 on a V[Vickers]MG of No. 3 Pl of D Coy of an Aust MG Bn. The Sec went into action but were forced to withdraw about 300 yards after they had suffered heavy casualities, one man being killed and six wounded. There were only six men, including the Pl Comd, remaining. During this withdrawal to the new posn Pte. McGREGOR went forward again, under heavy fire, and regardless of personal safety, to carry his No. 1, who had been wounded, back. He then returned and brought back his gun, and assisted in manning it. This section was largely responsible for the ultimate success of the attack '.
